
In 1942, Florise Spearman and Dorothy West Williams became the first African Americans ever to be hired at the Boeing Airplane Company. This came about after a long struggle for African Americans seeking the right to work at Boeing. Beginning in 1939 and throughout World War II, African American activism, combined with pressure from the federal government, finally forced the Boeing Company to integrate its workforce.

Something to Ponder

After organized baseball rejected signing black players in 1890, African-American baseball players formed teams in just about every major city in the country and at various levels, from amateur to semipro to professional. In Seattle, the Steelheads played in the West Coast Negro Baseball League and played their first game on June 1, 1946, against the San Diego Tigers, in front of 2,500 fans at Sick's Stadium. When the team traveled across the country to play, the Steelheads struggled to find places to stay overnight because white hotels refused to rent rooms to them.
